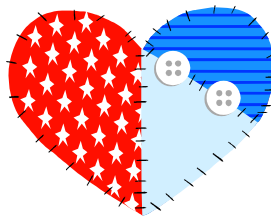

## Minutes for the December 14, 2009 General Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 PM by President Rae Brady. Rae recognized all those with birthdays in the month of December.

A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes from the November meeting as published in the December newsletter.

Vice President, Nancy Thyson had no report.

Toni Mayo, Treasurer, reported that the beginning balance for November 1, 2009 was \$9284.96 with income for the month as \$993.00. Expenses for the month were \$1897.65, leaving a balance of \$8380.31 as of November 30, 2009. Toni thanked everyone for their good work and asked them to continue it in 2010 as it makes her job much easier.

Membership Chair, Angela Owens, reported that there were four visitors and reminded all that membership renewal begins next month and dues will be \$20.00.

### **Committee Reports:**

**Birthday Raffle:** Chair, Beth Flores, reported 5 gifts for the raffle. If you did not bring a gift this month you can bring it the next time you attend the meeting.

**Block of the Month:** Chair, Fran Berrios, reported that there were two December blocks and that they would be given to Ruth Ellen MacDonald as she was the only contributor this month. Charlotte Cain will chair BOM next year and will be giving out appliqué blocks.

**Community Service:** Chair, Karen Roberson, announced that the guild had met the challenge of producing 200 quilts this year. There were drawings for the gift certificates and the \$100.00 challenge money. JoAnn Bueno was the lucky winner of the \$100.00. Remember ladies, the same challenge has been issued for next year.

**Event:** Co-Chair, Beth Flores, reminded those who would like to participate in the overnight retreat to sign up. A deposit would definitely be due in January.

**Hospitality:** Chair, JoAnn Bueno, thanked everyone for the wonderful food that was brought to share. She also thanked Kathy McLaren for all the help and decorations that were in place making Java Rock look so festive. JoAnn will be passing around the sign-up sheet for refreshments for 2010 so please sign up for either sweet, savory, drinks, or water.

**Newsletter:** Editor, Vicky Gibson, reported that she would be publishing her last edition as editor with the January newsletter. She would like all articles to be in to her by December 22, 2009 as she will be traveling throughout the holidays. Donna McDonald will be taking over the position of editor for 2010.

**Programs:** Chair, Kathy McLaren, will be stepping down and Elizabeth "Izzy" Saylor will be heading the program committee for 2010. Elizabeth has decided that Quilt Education will be the theme of next year's programs. She is taking us back to the "bare bones" of quilting since the guild is made up of members who have been quilting "forever" and of members who have just started quilting. After all quilting has changed a lot in the past few years (decades). In January, Parker, from The Circle Sewing Studio, will be demonstrating mitring corners, continuous binding, and hiding where binding is joined. February will be about "Quilt Speak" with games, puzzles, etc. to familiarize and remind us of the terminology of quilting. March's program will be about machine quilting and volunteers will be needed to bring sewing machines and demonstrate the techniques. In April there will be someone coming to talk about Featherweight machines. Elaine Stuckey has agreed to work with Elizabeth next year on Programs. Kathy also reminded everyone to be sure to pick up one of the needle holders on a key ring and a yoyo ornament kit tonight.

**Quilt Show Rep:** Sandy Johnson, Rep, and Jeanne Endrikat, Overall Show Chairman, reported that the members should be able to register their quilts on line for the show. They reminded everyone entering a

challenge quilt that it must be registered by January 15, 2010. The quilts for the show must be registered by January 31, 2010 with no exceptions. Carol Galaski handed out instructions about how to register and important dates to be aware of. As Boutique Chair, Carol also reminded everyone that there will be two Boutique workshops, one on January 16, 2010 from 10:00 AM until 4:00 PM and one on February 20, 2010 from 10:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. in Cornerstone Creations. Try to come and bring any ideas that you might have for items to make for the Boutique.

**Raffle Quilt:** Incoming Vice President, Fran Berrios, overall Chairman of the raffle quilt for 2010 and 2011, reported that for us to sell raffle tickets at Hampton we will have to provide 32 hours of volunteering for white gloving over a two day period. It is extremely important that we meet this obligation. If we drop out of the show for any reason, we may not get another chance to show our raffle quilt and sell tickets in future years. The show is held February 25 - 28, 2010. We need volunteers for 16 hours on both Thursday, February 26, 2010 and Sunday, February 28, 2010. We also need volunteers to man the raffle quilt table and sell chances. Please see Fran Berrios. She has a sign-up sheet.

Sandy Johnson has volunteered to head the construction committee for the 2011 raffle quilt. She has contacted Donna Rupert, from Piecing the Past and Donna has agreed to design the quilt for us in return for the publicity we will provide. After the quilt show Sandy will be asking for volunteers to help prepare the kits, put blocks together, and construct the quilt. As incentive for those who volunteer, a second smaller quilt of the same design will be made, and a drawing will be held from the names of those who work on the raffle quilt.

**Round Robin/Row by Row:** Round Robin Chair, Beth Flores reminded those who would be participating that their centers would be due at the February guild meeting and that they would need to sign up.

**Webmaster:** June Henkel, Assistant to Jeeves, reported that the website could use some updating. Any ideas or information should be given to her or Jeanne Endrikat.

**Old Business:** None

**New Business:** Kathie Latimer announced that information and sign-up for the Sew In on April 24, 2010 could be obtained from either her or Karen Roberson.

The combined Stone House and Cabin Branch Quilt Show is scheduled for March 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, 2010. Plans are already in progress as we strive to make the show special while retaining its informal atmosphere and personal warmth. In what will be its sixth year, the show will be held at the Prince William County Fairgrounds where the parking is free and ample.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE REGISTERING YOUR QUILT:

1. Guild members in good standing are encouraged to submit up to 5 quilted entries (does not include challenge quilts).
2. By submitting your quilt, you are giving permission for your quilt to be photographed by viewers.
3. There are two options for registering your quilt:
  - **On-line:** We are requesting that all quilt entries are entered into the online quilt registration database.
  - **Paper:** If you are not comfortable with the online process, please complete a Paper Entry form and attach a 4 x 6 photo. Paper forms will be available at the monthly guild meetings.  
**Remember, you can register your quilt even if it is not finished.**
4. **Picture guidelines:**
  - Before attaching your photo, make sure it is clear and represents the colors in your quilt.
  - **If you are completing the online registration:** Transfer your photo to your computer and make sure you know which folder it is in. Name your photo: Use your: **Last name, First Initial, name of quilt** (10-15 letters), and **quilt size** (width x length). **Do not use punctuation or spaces.** EXAMPLE: DoeJBloomingNinepatch34x45.jpg Photos submitted electronically cannot be more than 2 MB since the database space is limited.
  - **If you are attaching the photo to a paper enrollment form** put your name on the back of the photo and indicate the top of the photo.
5. If you had your quilt appraised by a professional, know what the written value is.
6. Know what category your quilt is in. Here are the categories along with descriptions
  - **CHALLENGE** – Special category. (Does NOT require entry of Piecing Method).
  - **TRADITIONAL** – Quilt is made using classic patterning and techniques.
    - **TRADITIONAL PIECED:** Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
    - **TRADITIONAL APPLIQUE:** Appliqué predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
    - **TRADITIONAL MIXED:** A quilt where a fairly even amount of both piecwork and appliqué is used to develop the design of the top.
    - **TRADITIONAL PICTORIAL:** A quilt that represents a recognizable image of a person, place, or thing; any size.
    - **TRADITIONAL OTHER:** A quilt where one special technique is used to develop the design of the top such as whole cloth (with or without trapunto), crazy quilt, cathedral window, embroidered, collage threadwork, etc.
  - **ART/INNOVATIVE** – Quilt made using original design reflecting innovative construction and design techniques, theme or subject matter, and/or materials. (No commercial patterns or copies of previous works).

- **WEARABLE** – Garment made using quilted fabric. (Does NOT require entry of Piecing Method).
- **MISCELLANEOUS** – Pillow, tree skirt, table runner, purse, bag, etc., made using quilted fabric. (Does NOT require entry of Piecing Method).

7. Measure your quilt and round the measurement to a whole number. Width (Left to Right) \_\_\_\_\_  
Length (Top to Bottom) \_\_\_\_\_

8. Know what pattern and designer you followed if you followed a pattern.

ON-LINE REGISTRATION GUIDELINES: [HTTP://STONEHOUSEQUILTERS.ORG/QUILTSHOWENTRY.HTML](http://stonehousequilters.org/quiltshowentry.html)

- Go to the web site:
- Fill in the required information for each entry
- At the bottom of the page when the online form asks you, browse through your folders until you find your photo, click on open and then hit add at the bottom of the form page. It may take awhile to upload your picture if it is large so please be patient. An hourglass on the page lets you know it is working.
- Review your submission and make sure you have attached the correct photo. Once everything looks good, hit **confirm**.
- Remember to print out a copy of your submission. You will need to provide this if the submission does not go through.

### TURNING IN YOUR QUILT:

Quilts will be turned in at the **February** guild meetings.

- Entries must be clean, dry, and free from all odors and pet hairs.
- If your quilt is king-sized (at least 90” wide), it must have a sewn 4 1/2” sleeve.
- Each entry must have a label with owner’s name, phone number and item title. Garment labels may be sewn on inside of the garment.

### PICKING UP YOUR QUILT:

Quilt pickup is on Sunday AFTER the quilt show has been broken down and the Quilt Take-in and Return Committee Chair announces that quilts may be released. No entry will be released without a receipt or written permission from the owner.

### HELPING AT THE QUILT SHOW:

As usual, we plan to exhibit quilted work from guilds, offer Silent Auction and Boutique items, sell tickets for our raffle quilts, and offer free demonstration classes to the public. To sign up to help set up or help during the show, please see Karen Williams (SHQ) or Sherry Bushee (CBQ).
