## 2017 SHQG Quilt Show Committee Positions Available

The following Chairperson positions are available. Please contact Nancy Thyson if you need more information or are interested in filling a position.

volunteer schedule to each volunteer. Recruiting should start at January Guild meeting. The shifts are 1 ½ hours long and include the following positions:

### BOUTIQUE CHAIRPERSON

The Boutique Chairperson is responsible for overseeing the activities of the SHQG Boutique. Because of the nature of the boutique, it is a yearlong process of workshops, handing out patterns and collecting donated items. The objective is to have new, fresh ideas and items to sell at a reasonable cost. The Chairperson should recruit a couple of people to assist her.

Activities include:

- setting up workshops to make a variety of handmade items
- collect finished items from workshops and individuals
- schedule a “Pricing Party” approximately two weeks before the show to price the items for sale
- take completed items to the show and set-up the boutique booth by arranging merchandise, tables, racks, etc.
- breakdown the boutique at the end of the show and store/pass along any leftover items to the next Boutique Chairperson.

Elaine Stuckey was the 2016 SHQG Boutique chairperson and is willing to work with the 2017 chairperson.

### VOLUNTEER CHAIRPERSON

The SHQG Volunteer Chairperson is responsible for recruiting guild members to work scheduled shifts at the 2017 show.

Several days prior to the show the Chairperson will email the

- **Admissions** – sell quilt show admission tickets
- **Baby Quilts** – help make baby quilts
- **Boutique** – work in boutique booth selling items
- **Breakdown** – breakdown the quilt show, on Sunday evening
- **Greeters** – greet visitors at the main entrance and answer any questions a visitor may have
- **Hospitality** – help with the food for the volunteers and vendors
- **Membership and Raffle Quilt** – sign up new members and sell raffle tickets
- **Quilt Distribution after the Show** – distribute quilts after the quilt show on Sunday evening
- **Setup** – assist setting up the show on Friday morning
- **Silent Auction** – work in silent auction booth
- **Volunteer table in hospitality room** – sign in SHQG volunteers and handout 2017 pins
- **White Gloving** – assist visits when asked to see the back of the quilts (wearing white gloves is required).

## Spotlight on Tools

My favorite tool is the Clover *Dome Threaded Needle Case*. Elaine Stuckey recommended this product to me and since I got one, I can't believe that I ever got along without it! The case stores 10 threaded needles all ready to use. For applique, you can thread needles with different colors of thread and you are already for color changes! If you are taking any hand sewing (hand piecing, binding, etc.) with you to an appointment, bee, Guild meeting or whatever, you thread your needles ahead of time, load your needle dome and you are ready to go! You don't have to take a spool of thread, fight with needle threaders or worse yet threading those little tiny needle eyes with tired human eyes. You can sit at a table, with rested eyes while you thread your needles and if you drop

them, they fall on the table and not into the upholstery of your chair or onto the carpet! I don't know about you but my eyes get tired by evening so threading needles early in the day for evening sewing is a bonus. Once you wrap your thread into the case, it stays neat and comes out without tangling. You'll find the *Dome Threaded Needle Case* in shops and online for \$9.50 - \$10.

She has been instrumental in the formation of private collections and handles hundreds of exceptional quilts. As a fabric designer, Mary has designed antique reproduction fabric for Timeless Treasure, Free Spirit, Blank Quilting. She presently designs for Windham Fabrics. Mary will tell us how she got started in quilting but more importantly, how she got into designing fabric.

**August 8<sup>th</sup>, Beth Flores.** Beth will talk to us about the different types of batting and how each one makes a difference in quilting.

## *July 16<sup>th</sup> - MorninGlory Designs Town and County Jacket Workshop*

The Town and County Jacket workshop is July 16, 2016 at Daffodil Quilts in Nokesville, Virginia. The following is information for members who have already signed up to take the class.

**Class Supply List:** Students should come to class with the pattern traced and cut out in the appropriate size, and the batting (or can use washed flannel or muslin should you elect to make a lighter jacket) and lining cut out as well. Bring fabric strips pre-cut to width but not to length and labeled.

- ◆ Scissors
- ◆ Straight pins
- ◆ Rotary cutter and ruler

The third Friday Morning Bee Community Service/Silent Auction Workshop was held on Friday, June 17<sup>th</sup>. With the help of so many, we now have 11 quilt tops finished and a few more started! **The next workshop will be held on Friday, July 22<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m.** The workshop meets at the Manassas Baptist Church (same building as our guild meetings). Please use the main entrance, the room is straight down the hallway on your right.

We will be starting a few more quilt tops, so please come by and join us. We have lots of donated fabrics to use for this worthwhile project.

**September 12<sup>th</sup>, Nancy Bills.** Nancy will provide a trunk show and talk about her method of making quilt blocks such as the Pineapple, Log Cabin, Off-center Log Cabin, Sunburst Star, and Geese in the Cabin (to name a few) with just squares and strips of fabric or scraps.

**October 10<sup>th</sup>, Frederick Nunley.** Frederick is a member of the Modern Quilt Guild and he will be presenting a trunk show of his modern quilts. His quilts are generally his original designs and he hand quilts using long stitch hand quilting and pearl cotton. He rarely uses fabric in traditional ways, often putting scraps together to make "new" fabric before cutting his blocks.

## Community Service Quilts

The guild has been donating Community Service Quilts to the following charities for over 15 years:

- **Walter Reed National Military Medical Center** (Quilt sizes: 50" x 60" and 72" x 90") - Walter Reed is one of the nation's largest and most renowned military medical centers. WRNMMC serves military families and our nation's active duty, returning war heroes, veterans and our Nation's leaders. Donated quilts are given to servicemen/women who have been injured in combat. Smaller quilts are provided to servicemen/women or used as gifts for the patients to purchase for their loved ones.
- **CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)** (Any size quilt) – These quilts are made from colorful fabrics and are presented to children for comfort allowing them to have something to call their own. The remainder are distributed to children who have been adopted within the last year at the November National Adoption Day Ceremony at the Prince William Court House in Manassas, Virginia.
- **Manassas and Gainesville Health and Rehabilitation Centers** (Quilt sizes: 36" x 39") – Provides comprehensive rehabilitation, long-term and respite care services, including physical, occupational

color in the palette. You may use all shades, tints and variations of your color. For example – if you choose green you can mix everything from pale green to olive to Kelly to hunter. If you go for red, you can use everything from pastel pink to harlot scarlet. You can use solids, tone on tone prints or prints with black and white. You may NOT use any print that contains colors other than your chosen one. For example, if blue is your color, you can use batiks in all shades of blue, but NOT if there are spots of purple. Embellishments are fine, but must also be in your color palette.
