## Community Service

More kits are coming, and thank you to everyone who has been taking them. If the pattern does not make sense or you do not have enough material feel free to email/call/text me. I am still looking into having some community sew in days. If anyone has a space (church, community room, etc.) that they know about, please let me know. Also a number of people have been leaving quilts by my chair at the guild meetings, which is totally fine, but could you then email/text me to let me know that you did so? I am trying to keep track for an end of year "thing." Thank you all so much!

The guild has been donating Community Service Quilts to the following charities for over 15 years:

- **Walter Reed National Military Medical Center** (Quilt sizes: 50" x 60" and 72" x 90") - Walter Reed is one of the nation's largest and most renowned military medical centers. WRNMMC serves military families and our nation's active duty, returning war heroes, veterans and our Nation's leaders. Donated quilts are given to servicemen/women who have been injured in combat. Smaller quilts are provided to servicemen/women or used as gifts for the patients to purchase for their loved ones.
- **CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)** (Any size quilt) – These quilts are made from colorful fabrics and are presented to children for comfort allowing them to have something to call their own. The remainder are distributed to children who have been adopted within the last year at the November National Adoption Day Ceremony at the Prince William Court House in Manassas, Virginia.

- **Manassas and Gainesville Health and Rehabilitation Centers** (Quilt sizes: 36" x 39") – Provides comprehensive rehabilitation, long-term and respite care services, including physical, occupational and speech therapy, audiology, cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation. Laps quilts are provided to patients for use due to their rehabilitation stays or used as prizes for Bingo, etc.

## July's Meeting Minutes

### **STONE HOUSE QUILTER'S GUILD MEETING**

**July 10, 2017**

The meeting was called to order by the president, Patrisha Wells, at 7:00 p.m.

Patrisha asked if everyone had picked up a ballot for the vote tonight as they signed in and had ballots passed out to anyone who did not have one. We would vote tonight on changes to the By-Laws. Patrisha asked everyone to correct their ballot. On the ballot regarding membership, in the first line the word "Life" appeared twice and it was corrected to "Associate".

Patrisha asked if anyone wished to volunteer to chair the nominating committee for 2018. Donna McDonald and Nancy Thyson volunteered for the nominating committee. Offices will need to be filled next year for vice president, secretary, membership (Karen Williams has volunteered for membership), the treasurer will continue to serve next year.

These members will receive the newsletter and will still be eligible for Guild activities, however, their numbers will not be used to calculate a voting quorum.***

Dates: September 14<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>

Location: Capon Springs, West Virginia. Capon Springs is an all-inclusive mountain resort where you can completely relax and recharge. The resort is less than 2 hours from Washington, DC. Meals are provided and served family style. The food is homemade and delicious. Everyone eats together around the table three times each day. We will be sewing in the big room and we can start at 11am on Thursday.

Once the retreat starts, we can sew as late as we want and start as early as we want. There is a wonderful spa where you can make your appointments for massages, hot tub soaks, etc. There are also several walking trails.

Cost: The cost for each night is \$118 Thursday, \$150 Friday, \$150 Saturday and all 3 nights is \$418. This is based on double occupancy. This includes all meals starting with Thursday dinner through Sunday lunch. If you would like to add lunch on Thursday the cost is \$12.72 which you would pay directly to the resort.

Golf: Golf is \$25 for all day. Cart fee is \$16. Dinner on Thursday is \$25.17.

### **"World War I Quilts"**

**Curated by Sue Reich**

By the turn to the 20th century, quilting was blending old styles with the fresh new ideas of business-minded quilt designers and pattern makers. But in 1917, America's soldiers went to serve on battlefronts in Europe and much of our nation's quilting became centered on the humanitarian efforts to provide for our soldiers and the Red Cross. The Red Cross quilt is the hallmark quilt of World War I. Its pattern was published by Modern Priscilla Magazine in December 1917, and combined quilting with fundraising for the Red Cross war relief efforts. Then in 1918, the influenza pandemic brought more hardship and death to America and the world. To help curb the advance of the flu, our government put a ban on joining together in groups, bringing quilting bees and Red Cross work to a virtual halt. Ironically, the flu also contributed to bringing the war to an end.

Our grandfathers and great grandfathers fought on the battlefields. Many quilts exhibited in this collection give a glimpse into the struggles of World War I and of the benevolent contribution of our grandmothers and great grandmothers on the homefront.

### **"Something Old is New Again: Needlework of the 20th and 21st Centuries" by the Shenandoah Valley Chapter of the American Needlepoint Guild**

**Curated by Gretchen Janesak and Laurie Kelly**

The study of needlework objects, which have historically served both decorative and functional purposes, provides insight into our history and the everyday lives led by our forebears. English and American schoolgirl samplers are familiar examples of decorative needlework that were prominently displayed in family parlors. But at the same time, the lines of alphabet on samplers offered practice of the skill used to embroider initials on household linens to identify the owner. Samplers recorded family events like births, deaths, and marriages. Pictorial motifs portrayed the spirit and economic or social status of the communities of embroiderers who worked them. Utilitarian purposes of needlework also extended to quilted fabrics that provided warmth and cushioning (under suits of armor); to embroidered bed curtains and valances for drafty bedchambers; and to needlepoint seat cushions providing the only comfort on hand-hewn wood furniture.

Items in this exhibit include family heirlooms, but the majority is needlework by Chapter members whose designs are consistent with the portrayed time frame. These contemporary works of art are the family heirlooms of the generations to follow.

### **"Windchimes" by the Fiber Artists @ Loose Ends**

Organized in 2005, the Fiber Artists @ Loose Ends encourages its members to explore new ideas and techniques by inspiring and nurturing creativity. Members express their passion for the textile medium by sharing their work in private and public venues. The ten members created this eight-part installation, featuring the four seasons and the four elements of Fire, Water, Air, and Earth. The eight pieces reflect each artist's unique style and individuality within parameters set by the group. Notice techniques that range from traditional quilting designs to painting on silk to fused fibers that have been stitched and then melted.
